- (c) I must beg your lordship's pardon for this digression from the true course of this epistle; but that it may not seem altogether impertinent, I beg that I may plead the occasion of it.
- (d) Tell me, ye prim adepts in scandal's men : but I could wish, at this time, that this address were exempted from the common pretence of all dedications.
- (e) The softer charm that in her manner liesIs framed to captivate, yet not surprise;It justly suits th' expression of her face, –'Tis less than dignity, and more than grace!
